Description: In this mixed methods study, we sought to evaluate the effectiveness of training institutes for the Curriculum for Agriscience Education (CASE) as a professional development initiative to retain, encourage, and assist school based agricultural education (SBAE) teachers in their classrooms and personal lives. We utilized qualitative interview data utilizing Swivl Mirror A.I. technology to find common themes, and then we combed through data to transcribe interview findings and analyze themes without A.I. technology. For quantitative analysis, the research team composed a survey instrument to gauge SBAE) intentionality to remain in the classroom, and how CASE impacted that decision.
