Accreditation

The Oklahoma State University Bachelor of Landscape Architecture (BLA) is nationally accredited degree program, successfully completing LAAB's 6-year re-accreditation process in 2022. Historically the BLA degree has been a 5-year 150 credit hours degree. In the Fall 2022 the BLA degree was changed to a 4-year 126 credit hour degree. Oklahoma State University BLA degree can be applied to licensure requirements throughout the United States as well as some parts of Canada.

The program is support by a committed, student focused faculty that bring a diverse mix of academic and professional experience to the classroom. This includes two faculty members that are professionally licensed.
